4. Runyon Canyon Park kiosks (Mulholland and Fuller entrances) – Guidelines for community postings and “lost and found” for park visitor keys.
5. 2450 Solar Dr. Recommendation of a stakeholder proposal that HHWNC recommend to Rec and Parks and CD4 that HHWNC opposes the sale of this property and will oppose any building/updates in the permitting phase and would like to look at possible funding sources to be used to turn property into an Upper Runyon ranger station. 6. The Open Space Work Group meeting recap of June 7, 2017: Background - LA Planning Department have held three Open Space Work Group meetings in private since February 2017. After exerting pressure on the Department through a California Public Records Act Request, and with follow up by several Neighborhood Councils who sent a letter to key city officials, the Planning Dept. agreed to open to the public the final meeting on June 7th. Recommendation of a stakeholder proposal that HHWNC recommend to the LA Planning Dept. to additionally hold at least three more Open Space Work Group meetings during hours when the public can attend, so that the public can have crucial input into shaping the City’s commitment to open space in the Los Angeles General Plan. Possible motion, discussion, and vote.
7. Wisdom Tree Trail: Recommendation of a stakeholder proposal that HHWNC recommend to RAP and the City to take specific actions in the management of traffic and other impacts to facilities and residents on Upper and Lower Wonder View Drive by those embarking on the “Wisdom Tree Hike.” Possible motion, discussion, and vote.

8. UPDATE: Upper and Lower Runyon Canyon Traffic Mitigation – Goals and possible next steps (Update from Alice Roth of CD4 schedule permitting)
 - a) Hollywood/Highland and Mulholland Drive DASH bus lines
