Comments from the public on non-agenda and agenda items will be heard during the Public Comment Period and, within the discretion of the presiding officer of the Board, when the respective item is being considered. Comments from the public on other matters not appearing on the Agenda that is within the Board's subject matter jurisdiction will be heard during the Public Comment period. Public comment is limited to 2 minutes per speaker unless waived by the presiding officer of the Board. PROCESS FOR RECONSIDERATION: The Board may reconsider and amend its action on items listed on the agenda if that reconsideration takes place immediately following the original action or at the next regular meeting. The Board, on either of these two days, shall: (1) Make a Motion for

Reconsideration and, if approved, (2) hear the matter and Take an Action. If the motion to reconsider an action is to be scheduled at the next meeting following the original action, then two items shall be placed on the agenda for that meeting: (1) A Motion for Reconsideration on the described matter and (2) a Proposed Action should the motion to reconsider be approved. A motion for reconsideration can only be made by a Board member who has previously voted on the prevailing side of the original action taken.  - a) LADWP Water Rates

HHWNC President Anastasia Mann has been in communication with CD4 and LADWP regarding high water rates in the Neighborhood Council area. LADWP has been invited to present to the Infrastructure Committee this spring to discuss the temperature zone designations and rate evaluation process. In advance of this meeting, we will compile a list of questions and suggestions for LADWP to consider in preparing their presentation to the Committee. LADWP will be invited back to a future meeting to discuss various energy efficiency and water conservation rebate programs that can help offset rates.

- b) LADWP Customer Bill of Rights: The City of Los Angeles Board of Water and Power Commissioners voted on January 17 to unanimously approve an initial version of the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power Customer Bill of Rights. The Commission also voted to extend the comment period for another 90 days to allow for stakeholders and Neighborhood Councils to provide input. The Customer Bill of Rights will be revisited and possibly revised after the comment period closes. Comments can be submitted via email to CommunityRelations@ladwp.com.
- c) Mudslide/Landside Updates: The recent winter weather has caused a few mud and rock slides in the HHWNC area, including: 8100 W Laurel View Dr., Nichols Canyon (2500 block, south of the entrance to the Alex Trebek Open Space and north of Jalmia), Mulholland Drive, and Laurel Canyon Boulevard. The Infrastructure Committee has contacted the city to facilitate a discussion about preparedness and how to react during and after such events. We will also be discussing areas of vulnerability and concern with the city. If you encounter any problem areas, please email them to infrastructurechair@hhwnc.org.

d) **MyLA311 Mobile Application:** The City of Los Angeles has a mobile application to supplement the phone and website 311 systems. The application will geographically identify your location and allows you to submit photos of the issue in question. This is an easy way

to notify the city of issues including: bulky/sanitation/special item pick-up; graffiti removal; street light service; homeless encampment reporting; pothole repair; and building and safety inspections.

With the recent wet weather, consider using 311 to report other issues like downed trees, and damaged street signs or inoperable traffic or street lights. For downed power lines, please call LADWP (1-800-DIAL-DWP) or 911 if the downed lines could pose a threat to people.

- e) Infrastructure Issues Matrix: The Infrastructure Committee will be creating a matrix of infrastructure issues for the HHWNC based on comments and feedback from members of the community. This matrix will be updated as feedback is received and used to track ongoing issues to be discussed with the appropriate council offices and city departments. This matrix will also be used in evaluating any new development projects in the surrounding area to determine if infrastructure upgrades are needed.
