- 4. Motion from Macapa Drive Homeowners Association:
- i. Milo and Eran Britton ("Applicants") are proposing to demolish the existing house at 7158 Macapa Drive and construct a new 3,750 square foot house, with a 1,000 square foot basement (the "Project"). On February 23, 2017 the Planning Department issued a determination letter for the Project (DIR-2016-2282-DRB) granting approval with conditions for Project Permit Compliance Review.
- ii. On March 8, 2017, the Macapa Drive Homeowners Association (the "Homeowners Association") appealed the Planning Department's approval of the Project to the South Valley Area Planning Commission. The Homeowners Association believes that the basement should be eliminated from the Project because the proposed excavation is inconsistent with the Mulholland Scenic Parkway Specific Plan, which requires that the Project be "designed so as to require a minimum of grading and retaining walls." The Homeowners Association has also pointed out that the geology of the Project site will require the excavation of granite/basalt bedrock, which will cause significant environmental impacts affecting air quality, noise, public safety, traffic and parking.
- iii. The Macapa Drive Homeowners Association recommends that the HHWNC Area 5 Committee recommend to full HHWNC Board to recommend to the South Valley Area Planning Commission that it grant the request of the Homeowners Association to eliminate the basement from the Project.
- 5. Motion to recommend that HHWNC board request Councilman Ryu join Councilman Paul Kerkorian in requesting that the city leverage it's data sharing partnership with WAZE (as announced by Mayor Garcetti) to reduce the impact of routing efficiency apps on residential neighborhood streets.
