Sundance/AMC scaled back its request to the City's Planning Department to (i) renewing it's conditional use permit to sell beer and wine for on-site consumption, (ii) extend its operating hours for such sales on Mondays through Thursdays from 11:30 p.m. to 12:30 p.m., and (iii) eliminate the existing CUP's condition which prohibited selling tickets to persons under age 21 when beer and wine is sold at the theater(s). The Planning Department's case no. is ZA-2018-5964-CUB. The CA CEQA no. is ENV-2018-5965-CE.

- ii. VALLEY VIEW ELEMENTARY— HHWNC is in contact with Liz Siapkaris, PTA president at Valley View, and Lorena Thornton (former PTA president) regarding needs for their media lab: iMac, iPads, software. They plan to follow up with a specific request for our April board meeting.
- iii. GARDNER ELEMENTARY— Gardner Elementary is in need of security cameras for their school. Principal Karen Hollis & Tracey Pence of FOG both spoke at our meeting in February addressing the need. They put together an estimate of the cost to install the cameras at the school. See attached estimate.
 - **Motion:** That the Board of the Hollywood Hills West NC approve the cost of \$8,467.11 to cover the cost of the security camera system at Gardner Elementary.
- iv. LAUSD—Reached out to Elmer Roldan regarding a parcel tax presentation at our May board meeting. - vi. ELECTION 1x bus stop sign & 100x lawn signs were purchased to inform our stakeholders of the election. The bus stop bench sign will be up near the corner of Hollywood & La Brea. Lawn Signs will be distributed to area chairs. See attached layouts.
- vii. AGING INTO THE FUTURE At our February board meeting, the board approved the cost of \$55 for Community Enrichment Chair to attend the conference on April 6.

Registration on pause till post-election. Chair must register for the conference prior to April 3.

- viii. NEIGHBORHOOD COUNCIL CHILDCARE We are investigating the cost & feasibility of providing childcare at HHWNC monthly board meetings with Drew Paonessa Secretary Arroyo Seco NC. We will research and discuss in detail post-election.
