E-Scooter Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

In December 2018, the Los Angeles Department of Transportation (LADOT) launched the **One Year Dockless On-Demand Personal Mobility Permit** to better understand the implications of dockless technology on the city and its citizens.

What rules or laws apply to e-scooters?

- Users must be 18 years or older and must have a valid California driver's license
- Users are not required to wear a helmet on e-scooters, but helmet use is strongly recommended
- Users may not carry additional passengers
- E-scooters cannot exceed 15 miles per hour

Where can I ride an e-scooter?

Users are required to follow the rules of the road.

Motorized scooter users must:

- When riding on-street, follow the rules of the road, follow all motor vehicle laws and ordinances in the City of Los Angeles

Don't ride:

- On sidewalks
- \$197 fine if found riding on the sidewalk

Don't park:

- In front of driveways, crosswalks, and transit stops
- Near ADA access ramps
- Near utilities (such as fire hydrants)
- Along color curbs (such as Accessible Parking Zones-blue and Loading Zones-yellow)
- On landscaped areas or grass
- On sidewalks less than 3 feet wide
- Leave at least 6 feet of sidewalk space for pedestrians and persons with disabilities

Citywide scooter cap:

3,000 per permitted company, with an additional 2,500 allowed in Disadvantaged Communities, as identified with DAC by CalEnviroScreen 3.0, and an additional 5,000 allowed in the San Fernando Valley.

Fees:

Permitted operators must pay an annual fee and a per vehicle fee to be used for program administration.

How much does it cost to rent a scooter?

Each company sets their own prices. Users typically pay to unlock the vehicle plus a fee for every mile or every minute of usage. Please refer to companies' websites for more information.

What low-income pricing options, cash payment options, and non-smartphone options are available?

The City has required scooter companies to provide a low-income fare option, a cash payment option, and a non-smartphone option. Please refer to the companies' websites for more information.

Who is enforcing State and City rules?

LADOT will ensure that the operators abide by the regulations outlined in the one year permit. Sidewalk riding is enforced by LAPD.

What will the City do with scooters that are not parked correctly? How do I report this and other concerns?

Improperly parked vehicles and other concerns may be reported to the company directly or to MyLA311. Any vehicle parked in any one location for more than 5 consecutive days without moving is subject to removal by LA Sanitation.
