**City of LA Departmental Public Information
Developments:**

Los Angeles Police Department (lapd.org)

- Law branch continues to track COVID instances, monitor business compliance, provide security at test sites, and facilitate transportation to COVID shelters.
- In the past 24 hours (04/16/20), there were 33 total calls:
 - Twelve medical-related
 - Three crime-related
 - One grocery store-related
 - Seventeen other
- No impact to patrol staffing.
- Assigned staffing for each 20 shelter centers and 8 test sites include:
 - 2 private security guards and 2 LAPD officers for each location.

Los Angeles Fire Department (lafd.org/alerts)

- LAFD overseeing MRC - (Medical Relief Center) for Non-Covid patients released from hospitals established at LA Convention Center - no patients currently - 250 beds (possible increase to 500).
- Continue to monitor and track 911 and mass gathering calls related to COVID-19.
- Continue to support existing testing sites in addition to mobile testing for convalescent homes.
- Produced 18+ Internal (10 of those external) videos on Fire Chief/UFLAC updates to members, Behavioral Health, COVID-19 policies and procedures, Drill Tower 19-1 graduation, telemedicine launch, and COVID-19 Testing, What to Expect." Continue to produce internal and external videos as needed.
- Regular Facebook Live and Instagram Live with Fire Chief on COVID-19
- Continue to fulfill media inquiries either outside City facilities with social distancing measures or remote video interviews with LAFD PIO's and Command Staff in English and Spanish.

- Business Ambassador Program:
 - On 04/16, ambassadors visited 5 businesses. A total of 1,410 businesses have been visited to date.
 - On 04/16, one citation was issued. A total of 82 citations have been issued to date.
 - Continued concerns include businesses not practicing social distancing and/or not wearing PPE, smoke shops continuing to operate despite multiple requests to close, and non-essential stores fulfilling online orders.

- StreetsLA has shifted street resurfacing projects and street sweeping to select high traffic streets and major commercial corridors to minimize impact on residential streets as more people are at home and vehicular traffic is less during this time. Over the weekend, StreetsLA completed street resurfacing work on 7th Street from Figueroa St. to Main St. in Downtown LA. - LA Sanitation and Environment has partnered with the YMCA to provide showers, bathrooms and locker rooms for unhoused individuals at nine YMCA facilities in the City.
- LA Sanitation and Environment will temporarily pick up additional trash or recyclables if needed on residents' regular collection day until further notice.
- StreetsLA, in partnership with Outfront JC Decaux, began the installation of hand sanitizing stations at heavily used bus stops.
- StreetsLA worked with farmers markets on social distancing and public safety operational plans in order to remain open. More than 30 farmers markets plans within the City have been approved.
- Parking enforcement has been relaxed for posted street sweeping routes, but residents must comply with other, temporary parking restrictions for StreetsLA street resurfacing, sidewalk repairs, and tree trimming projects or they risk being ticketed or towed.
- The Bureau of Engineering completed A Bridge Home shelter at the VA West Los Angeles Campus, which has capacity to house up to 50 homeless veterans.
- The Bureau of Engineering and LA Sanitation have assisted in the transport and provision of sanitary services, including the disinfecting and pumping out of septic tanks of 283 trailers from Hansen Dam to various sites. Overall 535 trailers were donated by the State of California to house patients.
- Engineering's Development Services Program is issuing permits and delivering all services via online applications or other electronic means such as email. For those few items that cannot be submitted electronically, customers can drop off materials for processing at specially designated

locations. Engineering is also now able to accept payment via electronic check. Please visit <https://eng.lacity.org> for more information on the special procedures in place, including dropoff locations, contact emails and phone numbers; and to apply for services online.

- The Bureau of Contract Administration inspectors are visiting construction sites to ensure that social distancing is being practiced and protective equipment is being provided.
- Bureau of Street Lighting crews continue their work to keep the streets of Los Angeles illuminated. In the last month, nearly 3,500 lights have been repaired.
- Street Lighting, in partnership with the DWP, is offering free electric vehicle charging through its electric vehicle chargers attached to streetlights in the City of Los Angeles.
- The Office of Community Beautification teams continue to remove graffiti and conduct public right-of-way cleanups, but are currently not engaging community service workers for their own safety.

Building and Safety

Continues to push construction sites to comply with the COVID-19 guidelines on developing a comprehensive exposure control plan. To date, no buildings or infrastructures have been impacted.

Key City Updates

- Mayor Garcetti announced the Emergency Senior Meals Response program to expand meals for seniors in need as they stay safer at home. Angelenos ages 60+ who are not currently participating in other meal programs can call 213-263-5226 between 9AM – 5PM to participate.
- The Navy has removed 116 medical staff members from the USNS Mercy after 7 members tested positive for COVID-19.
- Mayor Garcetti announced Tuesday, 04/14, that due to increased testing capacity, anyone with coronavirus symptoms can now book a same or next-day appointment.
- Mayor Garcetti announced Monday, 04/13, that one City employee passed away from COVID-19.
- Mayor Garcetti mandated that workers in essential businesses wear face coverings and authorized businesses to refuse service/entry to customers who are not wearing them.

Key National Updates: Updated April 17, 2020

- The White House released a three-phased guidance document on re-opening and told Governors that they could begin reopening businesses, restaurants and other elements of daily life by 05/01 if they choose to do so.
- All 50 states are under a major disaster declaration for the first time in United States history.

- The U.S. Navy announced the first COVID-19 death of a sailor aboard the USS Roosevelt crew, currently in Guam. Of remaining soldiers, 14% have tested positive for the virus.
- University of Washington's Institute for Health Metrics and Evaluation (IHME) model projected the number of American deaths from coronavirus has dropped dramatically due to social distancing adherence. o While the US is still expected to face a shortage of about 16,000 hospital beds, it will need 168,000 fewer beds than previously estimated, according to the new analysis.
- The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) announced a contract with General Motors to produce 30,000 ventilators under the Defense Production Act. The ventilators will be delivered to the Strategic National Stockpile by the end of August with a production schedule allowing for the delivery of 6,132 ventilators by 06/01.

Key Global Updates: Updated April 17, 2020

- CDC deployed eight community protection field teams as part of an initiative to work directly with state and local health departments to keep coronavirus cases contained where transmission rates are low.
