i. Pyramid Place- This is to support making Pyramid Place one-way from Montcalm to Mulholland, with the addition of bollards as necessary, as petitioned by the majority of the residents of said street to minimize and prevent illegal parking and loitering in the neighborhood. Pyramid Place has faced numerous issues over the years from illegal parking and activities taking place on their street.

LADOT is open to changing Pyramid Place to a one-way street going southbound from Montcalm Avenue to Mulholland Drive if the majority of the residents of the proposed one-way section petition for it, and this is supported by the HHWNC, and endorsed by Councilmember Ryu's Office. LADOT also specified the option of installing white plastic bollards to supplement the 'Tow Away / No Stopping' signs, to provide a physical deterrent to drivers wanting to park there.

There are 22 houses on Pyramid Place. One house is under construction, and another is vacant. Of the 20 occupied houses, 12 households have signed the petition. (See attachment)
