- IV. East Trail Renovation (CD4/RAP)The trail is very dangerous with major erosion on “steps”. 2020 Carryover Action: RAP evaluating options/final pricing to make the trail safer. Suggested Quimby Funds from CD4/CD13 to fund the solution. CD4/RAP still working an issue with the land donation to LA City. (CD4 Rep, Rec and Parks) Possible Motion, Discussion and vote. (Rec and Parks)
- V. West Trail Steps Restoration (CD4/RAP) The West Trail steps were built by property owner, and are deteriorated. There may be an issue with the Deed transfer of the land to the City.
  - 2020 Carryover Action: An in-house RAP team is evaluating options/prices for solutions to the failing stairs and other needs. (Rec and Parks)
- VI. The Mulholland Parking Lot Re-opening Discussion tied with CD4 and looking into a paid parking lot concept and closure of the lot when not enforced. CD4 to evaluate a DOT presence for some time period once the lot is reopened. The purpose is to ensure safety for neighborhoods. (CD4 Rep, Rec and Parks)
