a) NPG Funding for LAFD Fire Station 41

Fire Station 41, located at 1439 N. Gardner Street, is a Single Engine Fire Station with 18 firefighters. The station runs three 24 hour shifts of six firefighters. The NPG will allow Fire Station 41 to replace worn-out, old, broken or needed fitness training equipment. Fire Station 41 is the "first in" fire company that responds to the almost daily hiker rescues at Runyon Canyon Park and other hillside areas. Hiker rescues require an exceptionally high level of strength and anaerobic endurance. Firefighters need to exercise one hour during their 24-hour

shifts. This grant will provide them with the right equipment to stay fit and provide the best possible service to the community.
