Draft Minutes

- 1. Call to order by President, Anastasia Mann at 6:02pm.
- 2. Roll Call by Secretary, Britta Engstrom. Quorum established.

Absent: Environment Chair Barbara Witkin, Area 5 Chair Bob Mansell, Area 3 Chair Brian Dyer, Transportation Chair Jeff Straebler, Youth & Community Chair Jeremy Saunders.

3. **Approval of April 2021 Minutes.** President Anastasia Mann made a motion to approve minutes as submitted, First Vice President 2nd. The minutes were approved 15-0.

4. Public Official Reports

- a) CD4 Tabatha Yelos, Office of Councilwoman Nithya Raman thanked Infrastructure Chair Danielle Mead for her time serving on the HHWNC Board. The CD4 Office is hiring Climate Action fellows (summer job, 300 hours, ages 17-25). They are teaming up with Friends of the LA River for a river clean up on June 12. Tabatha encouraged stakeholders to reach out to CD4 regarding areas that their Clean Team can address (photos are always helpful).
- b) LAPD Hollywood & North Hollywood Divisions
 Officer Brian White (Hollywood) stated that Hollywood came in #2 in aggravated assaults recently
 and there is still concern with loud vehicles on Mulholland. Party house enforcement remains a
 priority and while many chronic locations have subsided, new ones have taken their place.

SLO Kurtis Delbar (North Hollywood) stated that there has still been an increase in grand theft auto but there has been a decrease in burglaries. They have been working with the bar, General Admission on creating some solutions to the noise complaints including turning music down and having Uber/Lyft do pick ups across the street.

c) LAFD – Chief Hogan gave an update on the Palisades fire and reminded stakeholders to continue to reach out if you are aware of people living remotely that could pose fire risks. Reach out to 311 or

go to www.lafd.org if you need to report something. They are looking at adding alert wildfire cameras in the Runyon Canyon area. Chief Hogan thanked the board for their support of their local fire stations.

- d) LADOT Brian Gallagher, Principal Transportation Engineer stated that they will begin the tour bus studies up in the hills starting in June. These studies will help determine where signage goes. Brian also spoke about the speed humps they recently installed on Mulholland near Coldwater. Soon after the installation they got requests for additional speed humps. It is looking like they will get an additional \$2-3 million for speed humps in the upcoming budget to be installed in the second half of 2022.
- e) 3rd Supervisorial District, Erin Seinfeld, Office of Supervisor Sheila Kuehl stated that the board looked at allowing free phone calls and no mark ups on basic commissary items for those in jail/prison/juvenile hall etc. Another motion put forward was to help unhoused people with stimulus payments, taxes etc. so the county is looking how to best assist. Supervisor Kuehl put a motion on that focused on how poverty and economic opportunity are amatter of public health (a pilot program). Additionally, June 5th will be a day of reflection that reaffirms LA county's commitment to end HIV/AIDS.
- f) 50th Assembly District-Josh Kurpies, Office of Assemblyman Richard Bloom stated that they found out they will have a \$76 billion dollars in surplus. The budget originally had a \$54 billion deficit, so they are pleased with the surplus. Some of the proposals include expanding the stimulus program and additional direct payments for families making \$75k and under which is 2/3rds of Californians. \$12 billion has been set aside to deal with homeless and \$7 billion of which is additional acquisitions for Project Room Key. The assembly will join with the senate to look at the budget and determine what that looks like. They are looking to increasing funding for homelessness issues, invest in CA's diverse communities etc.

5. Public Safety (Paul Jenkins) & Area 7 (Lincoln Williamson)

a) NPG Funding for LAFD Fire Station 41

Fire Station 41, located at 1439 N. Gardner Street, is a Single Engine Fire Station with 18 firefighters. The station runs three 24 hour shifts of six firefighters. The NPG will allow Fire Station 41 to replace worn-out, old, broken or needed fitness training equipment. Fire Station 41 is the "first in" fire company that responds to the almost daily hiker rescues at Runyon Canyon Park and other hillside areas. Hiker rescues require an exceptionally high level of strength and anaerobic endurance. Firefighters need to exercise one hour during their 24-hour shifts. This grant will provide them with the right equipment to stay fit and provide the best possible service to the community.
