SB 411 Updates:

In the event of a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting to members of the public using the call-in option or internet-based service option, or in the event of a disruption within the eligible legislative body's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comments using the call-in option or internet-based service option, the eligible legislative body shall take no further action on items appearing on the meeting agenda until public access to the meeting via the call-in option or internet-based service option is restored. Actions taken on agenda items during a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting may be challenged pursuant to Section 54960.1.

- (C) The eligible legislative body shall not require public comments to be submitted in advance of the meeting and shall provide an opportunity for the public to address the legislative body and offer comments in real time.
- (D) Notwithstanding Section 54953.3, an individual desiring to provide public comment through the use of an internet website, or other online platform, not under the control of the eligible legislative body, that requires registration to log in to a teleconference may be required to register as required by the third-party internet website or online platform to participate.
- (E) (i) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed public comment period for each agenda item shall not close the public comment period for the agenda item, or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph (D), to provide public comment until that timed public comment period has elapsed.
- (ii) An eligible legislative body that does not provide a timed public comment period, but takes public comment separately on each agenda item, shall allow a reasonable amount of time per agenda item to allow public members the opportunity to provide public comment, including time for members of the public to register pursuant to subparagraph (D), or otherwise be recognized for the purpose of providing public comment.
- (iii) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed general public comment period that does not correspond to a specific agenda item shall not close the public comment period or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph (D), until the timed general public comment period has elapsed.

LAPD –Hollywood, Captain Craig Heredia (31900@lapd.online); Hwd Hills, SLO Joe Raviol (40541@LAPDD.online); Hwd Ent, Officer Brian White (38074@lapd.online); HHW Flats, SLO Brian Oliver (37349@lapd.online); LAPD NoHo, Officer Kurtis Delbar (38887@lapd.online). Joseph Raviol shared that more resources have been deployed to patrol and prevent crimes in the Hollywood Hills at the direction of Captain Heredia. There is approval given for extra patrols to combat burglary issues in the Hollywood Hills. There is a total of 28 burglaries for the year to date. There will be a task force for issues involving tour buses and traffic violators in the next couple of weeks. He's working with reserve officers to check our reported encampments in Runyon Canyon. Chad Costello shared that crime is down 40% compared to last year. There is a big effort to reduce crime and it's been successful in Hollywood. Rapes are up and those are typically acquaintance crimes or alcohol crimes which is being combatted by training at ABC locations.

LAFD Assistant Bureau Commander Joseph Everett (joseph.everett@lacity.org), Battalion Chief Mark Schroeder (Mark.Schroeder@lacity.org), Battalion Chief Mattias Wikstrom (mattias.wikstrom@lacity.org), Battalion Chief Timothy Ramirez (timothy.ramirez@lacity.org), Deputy Chief Phillipp Fligiel (phillip.fligiel@lacity.org). Joseph Everett shared that the statistics provided were based on 41. 82% of responses are EMS related and the response time from when the call is received to arrival on scene is just under 8 minutes. It takes longer to get to scenes in the Hollywood Hills. Firefighters are getting out of quarters and on scene to serve the needs of the community. There were close to 83,00 calls generated in the city in quarter one. There were 848 calls in quarter one in the Hollywood Hills. Mailers have gone out for brush clearance which should be complete by May 1. Anastasia Mann was nominated and accepted Honorary Fire Chief for the area. They will be celebrating at Fire Station 27 and will have an open house May 10.2

1. NPG Grant for \$4,900 to the Los Angeles Fire Department Foundation for work at Station 76

This grant will fund the balance of the irrigation system for the expansion of the community garden by transforming the remaining untouched hillside into a productive space for the growth of fruit trees and vegetables. Once completed, the entire back hillside will serve as a Community Education Center, benefiting local residents and students from neighboring schools. It includes a complete irrigation system to water the balance of the backyard orchard. It will also include extending the pathway in the hillside from the patio area through the second half of the backyard orchard, with irrigation lines on both sides of the pathway. The concrete walkway will also be extended from the backyard to continue an additional approximately 50 feet adjacent to the chain-link fenced parking area. Railroad ties will be used to secure the hillside soil from the concrete pathway. **POSSIBLE PRESENTER: ROBIN BLAU, PROGRAM NANAGER, LA FIRE DEPT, FOUNDATION**

Community Benefit:

The planned expanded garden will serve as a sanctuary for growing organic fruits and vegetables, enhance local ecology, and promote the mental and physical well-being of the members of LAFD Station 76, who consider it their second home. Harvesting produce will play a central role in the station's vision for a Community Education Center, fostering connections between neighborhood adults and children. Local students, along with nearby residents, will receive gardening education, and volunteer opportunities will encourage community engagement with the station.

J Anderson shared, as of Friday, April 11 in Upper Waddles, the grass has reopened. Lower Waddles will remain closed a bit longer because there is still maintenance that need to be conducted. On May 17 they will be hosting a Runyon Canyon recovery volunteer day from 9 am to noon. This will include invasive species removal, native plant planting and some brush clearance. LA residents have a LA Sanitation rate increase pending for single family homes, duplexes, triplexes, etc. This fee has been the same since 2008. The rate increase will include a robust community engagement process.

- b. 51st Assembly District, Robbie Staenberg (Robbie.Staenberg@asm.ca.gov) Office of Assemblymember Rick Chavez Zbur. Robbie shared that the California Retail Reduction Act co-authored by Assembly Member Zbur has contributed to the reduction in in property theft. This legislation imposes tougher penalties on shoplifting rings, protecting businesses and consumers from repeat offenders. Law enforcement is afforded more authority to combat retail crime and theft. The Assemblymember has bills around climate, energy and the environment, including a bill that would requires cities and counties to adopt a plant to meet their electrification goals. This would ensure local governments are everybody has electric vehicle charging infrastructure. He also has a bill to streamline transmission permitting, which would ensure that priority, electrical infrastructure projects for the state, get done. He's also working on a community college student housing bill which would allow community colleges to build student and staff housing on property that they own. 60% of California's community college students face housing insecurity and almost 25% have experienced homelessness. He's also looking to increase the film tax credit from 330 million to 750 million to support keeping Hollywood in California

 Dina Andrews shared that the City Clerk has received 142 vote by mail applications and have processed 91. These are not the final numbers as they are still being processed. The mayors office had an infrastructure meeting with the Mayor's Office, Board of Public Works, Office of Community Beautification, and my clean LA for the neighborhood councils. Service Day LA, Together LA Shines is April 26 at 9 am. Hollywood, South LA, Boyle Heights, Echo Park, West LA, San Fernando Valley regions coming together to make LA Shine in honor of Earth Day. This is Mayor Bass, partners, neighbors cleaning, greening, and preparing LA for the world stage. The homeless liaisons virtual meeting is April 30 from 6 8 pm. This meeting is for NC and public. 4) Please describe the purpose and intent of the grant.

This grant will fund the balance of the irrigation system for the expansion of the community garden by transforming the remaining untouched hillside into productive space for the growth of fruit trees and vegetables. Once completed, the entire back hillside will serve as a Community Education Center, benefiting local residents and students from neighboring schools. It includes a complete irrigation system to water the balance of the backyard orchard. Extend the pathway in the hillside from the patio area through the second-half of the backyard orchard, with irrigation lines on both sides of the pathway. Extend the concrete walkway from the backyard to continue an additional approximately 50 feet adjacent to the chain-link fenced parking area. Use railroad ties to secure the hillside soil from a new concrete pathway.

5) How will this grant be used to primarily support or serve a public purpose and benefit the public at-large. (Grants cannot be used as rewards or prizes for individuals)

The planned expanded garden will serve as a sanctuary for growing organic fruits and vegetables, enhance local ecology, and promote the mental and physical well-being of the members of LAFD Station 76, who consider it their second home. Harvesting produce will play a central role in the station's vision for a Community Education Center, fostering connections between neighborhood adults and children. Local students along with nearby residents will receive gardening education, and volunteer opportunities will encourage community engagement with the station.






