Please note that under the Brown Act, the Board is prevented from acting on a matter that you bring to its attention during the General Public Comment period; however, the issue raised by a member of the public may become the subject of a future Board meeting. Public comment is limited to 2 minutes per speaker, unless adjusted by the presiding officer of the Board.

In the event of a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting to members of the public using the call-in option or internet-based service option, or in the event of a disruption within the eligible legislative body's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comments using the call-in option or internet-based service option, the eligible legislative body shall take no further action on items appearing on the meeting agenda until public access to the meeting via the call-in option or internet-based service option is restored.

Actions taken on agenda items during a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting may be challenged pursuant to Section 54960.1. **California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(3).**

The legislative body shall not require public comments to be submitted in advance of the meeting and shall provide an opportunity for the public to address the legislative body and offer comments in real time. **California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(4).**

Notwithstanding Section 54953.3, an individual desiring to provide public comment through the use of an internet website, or other online platform, not under the control of the eligible legislative body, that requires registration to log in to a teleconference may be required to register as required by the third-party internet website or online platform to participate. **California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(5),**

A legislative body that provides a timed public comment period for each agenda item shall not close the public comment period for the agenda item, or the opportunity to register, pursuant to paragraph (5), to provide public comment until that timed public comment period has elapsed.

California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(6)(A),

A legislative body that does not provide a timed public comment period, but takes public comment separately on each agenda item, shall allow a reasonable amount of time per agenda item to allow public members the opportunity to provide public comment, including time for members of the public to register pursuant to paragraph (5), or otherwise be recognized for the purpose of providing public comment.

Captain Chavez provided an overview of his background and his role in the Hollywood Division. He reported decreases in violent and property crime in the Entertainment District due to increased patrols and partnerships. He also addressed ongoing burglary concerns, noting enhanced enforcement, recent arrests, and coordination with other agencies, and announced upcoming high-visibility patrol support from the California Highway Patrol in the Hollywood Hills.

Hollywood Partnership

Ms. Rawson will provide an update on activities with the Hollywood Partnership and Hollywood Boulevard Ambassadors. (15 Min. + Q&A)

Kathleen Rawson, President of the Hollywood Partnership, provided an overview of the organization's services, including clean and safe programs, place enhancement, and economic development efforts funded through property assessments and fundraising. She noted that Hollywood operates with significantly less funding than comparable tourist districts, resulting in lower service levels. To address this gap, she introduced a proposed "Hollywood Reinvestment Initiative," which includes renewing the property-based assessment district and creating a Tourism Improvement District to generate additional revenue through a small consumer fee, with funds reinvested locally to improve services and the overall visitor experience.

Outreach Chair, Brion Morrison provided an update on the City Charter Reform Commission process, noting concerns with the ad hoc committee's initial dismissal of LANC recommendations and subsequent reconsideration by the full commission. He outlined key proposals focused on strengthening neighborhood councils, including clearer roles in the Charter, expanded participation in city meetings, increased notice and input on city actions, and potential budget and governance reforms. He also highlighted the accelerated timeline of the reform process and encouraged continued community engagement.

Senior Lead Officer Joe Raviol reported an increase in residential burglaries in the Hollywood Hills from mid-January to early February, attributed to an organized group targeting homes—primarily entering through rear sliding glass doors and stealing valuables. In response, LAPD has increased patrols during peak hours (5 PM–11 PM) and is coordinating with neighboring agencies. He encouraged residents to report suspicious vehicles and share security footage, noting license plates are key to investigations. He also advised on preventative measures, including removing home interior photos from real estate websites, installing window security film, and ensuring cameras capture street views. Additionally, he provided updates on the LAPD drone program, emphasized transparency, and noted ongoing enforcement efforts in high-traffic areas like Mulholland overlooks.
